Michigan DNR Fishing Tip

Catching Bass on Top of the Water

Many anglers would agree there’s an excitement that comes when you’re using topwater techniques to target bass. There’s something to be said for seeing a bass strike your lure with your own two eyes.

But how do you fish for this species on top of the water? It mostly comes down to location and lure selection.

Target areas that provide good cover for the bass that have a few feet of water over them, such as weed beds, logs, big rocks, etc. Cast a floating lure next to the cover and play with it a bit before reeling it in.

When it comes to lures, select those that float and are designed to resemble the favorite foods of bass, such as frogs.

Also, top water fishing for bass works best in low-light conditions such as early in the morning or late in the evening.

Fowlerville Veterinary Clinic staff member retiring after 44 years at job

“The Voice” of the Fowlerville Veterinary Clinic is retiring after 44 years on the job. Kathy DeForest, who has served as a receptionist-secretary and done a myriad of other tasks, is finishing her long career this Thursday, August 22.

“They call me ‘The Voice’ because I’m on the phone recording that people hear when they call and I’m often the one who answers the phone,” she explained.

But her duties over the years went far beyond that responsibility—essential though it is. “I make appointments when people call,” she said. “I help the bookkeeper by making deposits. I sorted the mail. At one time or the other, I’ve done all of the jobs. While being a technician is not my thing, Dr. (Art) Currey had me do that.”

Kathy started out in 1974 by manning the Clinic’s after-hours emergency phone service from her Fowlerville village home, being on-duty from 5 p.m. to 8 a.m. “Back then we used a CB radio to contact the doctors,” she noted. “Our handle was KQC675.”

At that time the office was located on North Grand Avenue and there were three doctors: Dr. Donald Langdon, Dr. Harvey Carlon, and Dr. Art Currey. “Claudia Cary Davidson was the new technician, and Mary Peterson served as the bookkeeper.”

In 1981, Kathy became a fulltime staff member and worked in the office. “I took over for Louisa Grill who had worked there for 19 years,” she pointed out. “Living in the village, I never missed a day of work due to ice or snow. I could walk to work or, if necessary, the doctors would send someone to pick me up.”

From the three veterinarians she started out with, Kathy saw the number grow and also doctors coming and going—some retiring and others taking new positions elsewhere. “I’ve worked for 47 doctors since I’ve been here,” she said.

During that time frame, the staff also grew in numbers and, at present, there are 13 doctors who are assisted by a total of 18 technicians and front-office workers.

Kathy noted that the office on North Grand Avenue was enlarged and then a new building was erected on Grand River at the corner of Hogback Road, east of town. That new clinic featured five exam rooms plus a treatment area for surgeries to handle the small-animal patients, as well as an area in back for accommodating and treating large animals.

The Clinic, due to a continued growth in business, is in the process of enlarging their building. “We’re adding four more exam rooms, and also creating an exit area,” Kathy explained. “This way our clients and their pets can come into the current entry area, be taken care of by the front-desk staff, see the doctor, and then be discharged and exit from another area. It should relieve some of the congestion that can occur.”

Much of the increase in business and a major change from when she started at the Clinic is the growth in small-animal clients accompanied by the decrease in large-animal business—the latter usually requiring the veterinarian to go on-site rather than have the animal brought to the office.

“When I started, probably 80 percent of the case load was large animals—mostly farm livestock—the doctors would drive from farm to farm,” Kathy said. “They were just starting to do small animals in the Clinic.”

This ratio, she added, has reversed during the past four-plus decades, due in part by people wanting better care for their pets and in part to the decline in small farms, in particular fewer and fewer dairy operations.

One variation to that trend, Kathy pointed out, was horses. “When Dr. Carlon came, he branched off from the farm livestock and did a lot of work on horses. That remains a part of the business.”

While treating animals is the main mission of the veterinarians and staff, the reality is that animals end up dying, with many being put out of their pain and misery via euthanasia.

Comforting pet owners with their loss and ensuing grief has also been a part of the job—one that Kathy said she was willing to accept.

“You end up crying with them,” she said. “When people lose their pets, they’re not just losing an animal, but oftentimes a member of the family. One of the tasks I’ve done is to send sympathy cards to people who lost a pet, letting them know we’re thinking of them.”

WHILE HER 44-YEAR CAREER AT FOWLERVILLE

VETERINARY CLINIC is noteworthy, in and of itself, Kathy DeForest is an active, multi-faceted lady and has other aspects of her life that are interesting.

She’s a longtime member of the First United Methodist Church in Fowlerville where she has been a Sunday school teacher for 40 years (30 of them teaching the adult class) and part of the church’s laity. “I was the lay leader for 17 years and am now one of the lay persons,” Kathy said. “I’ve occasionally offered the Sunday sermon and given messages at funerals and women’s retreats.”

She’s currently a part of the Praise Band and in the past sang in the choir. Past duties included serving as the church’s wedding coordinator and being the housekeeper for 25 years.

Her active faith has taken her beyond the church. “I’ve put on the grief-share class for the Family Impact Center for 13 years,” Kathy said. “It’s a 13-week course that the Center offers twice a year. At first we hosted it at the Methodist Church, but now it’s offered at the Wellness Center.

“For seven years I worked with another woman to offer the ‘Forgotten Man Jail Ministry’ for ladies who were in the Livingston County Jail,” she noted.

Still another service she took part in was the ‘Heavenly Helper.’ “Rita Coleman, Nancy Sanders, and I would assist at special occasions like graduation open houses and anniversaries—serving food and cleaning up afterwards,” Kathy explained. “The idea was to allow whoever was putting on the party an opportunity to enjoy it and not have to worry about all these other details.”

From 2011 to 2017, Kathy also found time to work for Bridget Gallagher’s, assisting the former owners Don and Maureen Call with the guided-tour portion of their business that offered trips to Ireland, Northern Ireland, and Scotland. “I met people at the airport both to send them off and welcome them back,” she said. “I also helped with the pre-trip meetings that were held.”

She added that she was able to go on four of these tours. In preparation for her retirement, Kathy sold her home in Fowlerville and has been staying at her daughter and son-in-law, Nicole and Dan Whitt’s home in Stockbridge. Plans are to split time between this place and at St. Joseph (on the west side of the state) with her son Tad and daughter-in-law Julie.

“I’ll be going back and forth,” Kathy said. “At both homes I’ll have my own area, and being retired will give me a chance to spend more time with the grandchildren who are still at home. My daughter Kim and son-in-law Tom Lockwood are just settling into their new home, but they’ve invited me to visit them.”

Her grandchildren, who range in age from 25 to 12 years, are Jocelyn, Shelby and Grace Lockwood, Faith, Sylvia and Zane Whitt, and Kyle and Jillian Natasha DeForest.

While these new living arrangements will allow her to remain in contact with Fowlerville and the Methodist Church, the part-time basis will necessitate a few changes in her current routine. “I’ll have to give up the Sunday school class and being the facilitator of the grief-share class,” she said, “But I can take part in other activities when I’m around, like singing in the Praise Band.”

Kathy DeForest is retiring from Fowlerville Veterinary Clinic after 44 years. She has served most of this time as the front-desk receptionist and secretary and also answering phone calls.

KATHY WAS RAISED IN LANSING, graduating from Everett High School in 1966, but her Fowlerville roots are deep. “My grandfather was T.D. Sherwood,” she said. “He and J.D. were brothers, so Jack and Lucy Sherwood are cousins. My mother’s maiden name was Beck and her family was from Fowlerville.

“My parents were Gerald and Phyllis Sherwood and my dad moved to Lansing since he worked at Fisher Body,” she added.

While in high school, Kathy secured a job as a switch-board operator for Michigan Bell. “We were taught diction and how to put words across clearly, so it turned out to be wonderful training when I started answering phones at the Clinic and serving as a lay minister,” she said.

She noted that she also worked on the school paper and won a Future Homemaker of America award. After graduation, Kathy attended Lansing Community College, taking business courses. Perhaps of more value, she was hired as a secretary with the counseling department and then joined one of the counselors to establish the Dept. of Financial Aid and Placement.

This department, she said, helped students secure funding to pay for their classes, including finding employment.

During this period of her life, she met her future husband, Glen DeForest. “I met him through a friend and then found out he was from Fowlerville,” she said. “It turned out that our families knew each other.

Glen and Kathy have four children: Kimberly, Tad, Nicole, and Tashia.

They lost Tashia at age five due to a traffic accident, while Glen passed away a few years later.

“You go on,” Kathy said, “but when Barb (Dine) talked me into doing the grief-share class, I found out that even with the passage of time, I needed to share my grief as much as those who were attending the session.”

As Kathy looks forward to splitting time between her homes in Stockbridge and St. Joseph and spending more time with her grandchildren, she added that she plans to be active. “I’m a people person, so I can’t see me not doing anything. I want to go back to Ireland, and I’d love to volunteer at my grandchildren’s schools. I know there are other, new adventures waiting for me, and I’m anxious to see what they are.”

Judge Brennan Hearings & Next Steps

The Judicial Tenure Commission has issued an amended complaint against Judge Theresa Brennan outlining in more detail the numerous allegations of professional and personal misconduct against her. The 87-page document shows an embarrassing level of impropriety that has plagued Brennan's tenure as a judge. This impropriety has also kicked off a lawsuit from Livingston County for alleged routine misuse of employees under her supervision for personal gain.

The Judicial Tenure Commission has posted a scheduling order for the complaint that shows the next steps for the procedure in this issue. Formal complaints against Brennan will be discussed in hearings this October.

I'm disappointed the hearings will not take place in Livingston County, where the people wronged by Brennan's actions could be present. At the same time, I'm glad to see that these proceedings are in motion and that justice may finally be served.

I'd like to thank everyone that sent in their tragic stories about how Brennan has impacted their lives. I have been working hard on your behalf to press for accountability and to keep the people informed of this issue and what is going on. Rest assured breaches of justice like this will not go ignored.

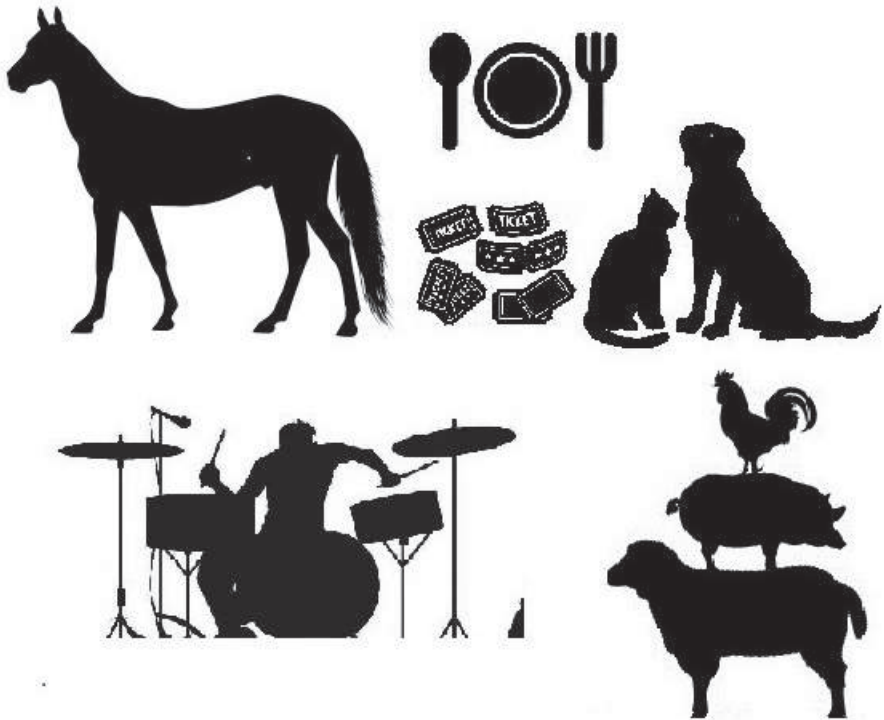
